The Law of Moses, and particularly the book of Leviticus, pays a great deal of attention to who is clean and who is not. There is more to this than personal habits and hygiene, and more is at stake than catching someone else's germs or disease. The ability to worship, to go into the Temple, is at stake. A person's eligibility to be part of the community is related to being clean or unclean—to being worthy or unworthy.

Did it matter to Jesus whether people fit into the categories around him? He did not avoid the unclean; he touched them. At the same time, he was careful to integrate them into the community when they were healed. After healing the leper in Mark's Gospel, Jesus told him to show himself to the priests as the law prescribed. But before any of that, Jesus touched him—so he could rejoin the group. (And then the guy couldn't keep quiet about it.)

Do we find these old rules odd today?

We have our own ways of avoiding sickness and contagion. We have other ways of deciding who should be included in our group.

So, who is in and who is out?

Imagine having lunch with someone you don't want your friends to see you with. (What is he wearing? Where does she live? How does he talk? What kind of work does she do?) What if your friends saw you together? What if you couldn't explain

that you were just helping that person, maybe giving advice—maybe you were doing some sort of community-service work?

Your friends would just think you were hanging out together. They would think you were friends. They would think you two were the same.

In Jesus' time, you didn't befriend the unclean. You certainly didn't eat with them. But Jesus touched and healed them. Did he eat with them too?

What can parishes do for those who have lost a spouse?



My parish celebrates anniversaries for couples, but nothing is done for widows and widowers. How do you think that makes us feel?

Feeling Neglected

Dear Neglected,

I have often said to a widow or widower, "I am happy for all the years you had together and sorry for the end of them." Sometimes it has occurred to me to call a widow or widower on the anniversary of the spouse's death. But only with my brother or sister would I even know to say, "This is the day you got married. Congratulations for all the years."

I am sure we do not know, *really* know and understand, how you feel. When I speak with couples and one of them is dying, I am pierced with the sense that this marriage—what has gone on between this couple and is ending now—is uniquely theirs. No one else truly enters and understands.

So how can we in our parishes honor that? I have only this thought. On or around the feasts of Saint Joseph (March 15) or the Assumption of Mary into heaven (August 15), there might be a Mass or service to honor the spouses who wait for the resurrection and their return to their beloved husbands and wives. This would also provide an occasion to remember that Mary and Joseph were truly husband and wife. Mary loved him and lost him in this life, as you lost your spouse. She now rejoices with him in heaven. You too will know that rejoicing.
