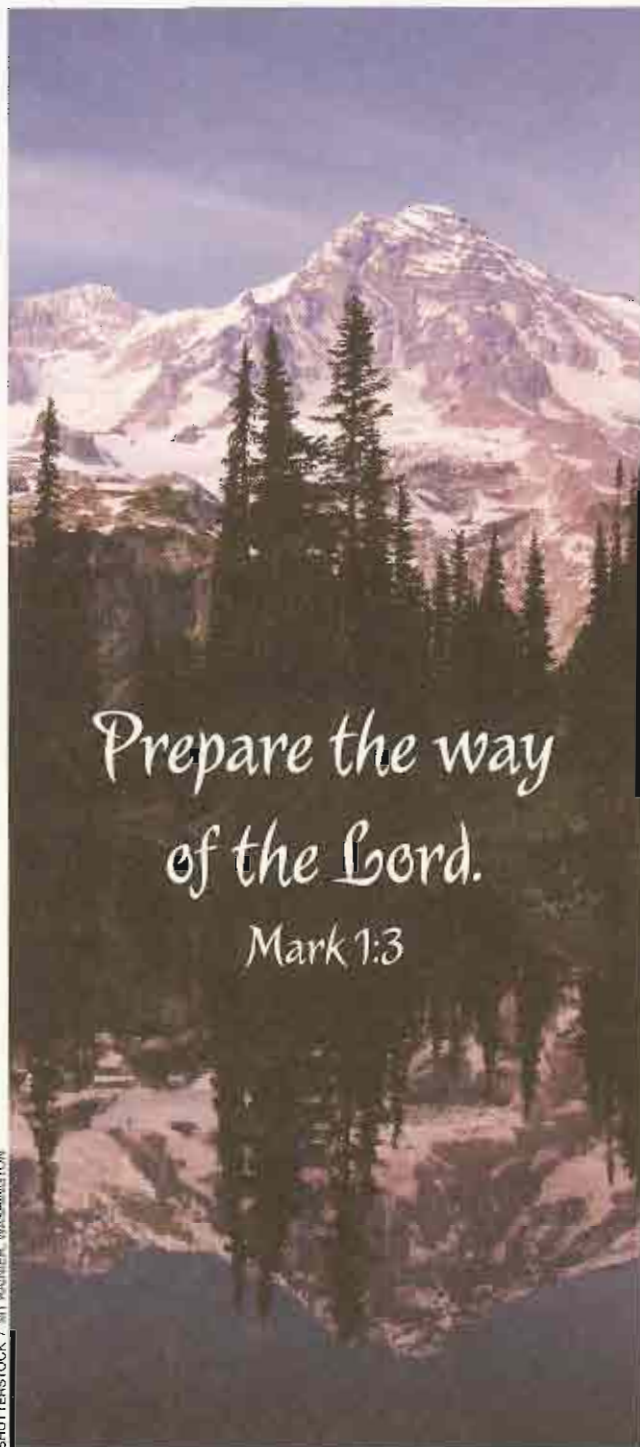

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Prepare the way  
of the Lord.  
Mark 1:3

## Today's readings are the stuff songs are made of.

“Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low” (Isaiah 40:4).  
“Prepare the way of the Lord” (Mark 1:3).

Yet as much as our hearts are lifted to sing, foreboding lies in these texts. Isaiah and Mark work hand in hand during Advent to tell us God does what is promised. But we hear the strain in their message. In Isaiah, a voice cries out. Mark's Gospel begins in a wilderness. There is Good News—a messenger has come. But he is stark; he wears camel's hair and eats strange food. He is stripped down in waiting. He is honest, though, and clear-sighted.

The somber tone of the message fits our need. If we are honest, during this season and often in other times, we feel troubled. Our liturgical tradition is blunt; we wait for the light that comes into the world because we need the light. Watch the news. What do so many places in the world lack?

Our waiting is hard. As desperately as we need it, hope can be incredibly difficult for us. It is serious business, creating a new heaven and a new earth. Hope can be explained only by metaphors of large-scale change—mountains torn down and valleys filled up. What will it take in our world, to create a place “in which righteousness dwells?”

The power of the Gospel is in this; God enters where we are. We cannot explain why the world knows pain; we cannot explain while we wait. But we know God uses what we have *here*. We need redemption, but we *are* worth saving. God is not slow. God is patient.

The second letter of Peter reminds us we are waiting. We know that all too well. Do we dare sing while we wait?

# Dear Padre

## Where should I pray?



Where is the best place to pray? I can't get to church every day. I have a noisy household, and I can't

pray at work. Any ideas?

Dear Michael,

The best place to pray is in solitude. But solitude in this case doesn't mean an isolated place; it is, rather, a state of the heart.

Many Christians can enter into a state of solitude on a crowded train. I've talked with others who find solitude while sitting on a bench in a crowded shopping mall.

However, to cultivate this interior state that opens a Christian to heartfelt conversation with God, many of us need to physically shut out distractions. As Jesus advised, go into your room—your secret place—close the door, and pray there.

For some people, this "secret place" is a church or chapel. Many people pray before or after Mass. Some churches have a special oratory or chapel for the Blessed Sacrament. But, like you, many people find it difficult to go to a church or chapel every day, so some of them

devote a special corner of their home to prayer. This prayer corner usually has a Bible, crucifix, statue, sacred picture, candle, or plant.

We can find solitude in the car, in a favorite nature spot, in the garden, or on a morning jog. Once you start looking for it, solitude isn't as difficult to find as you might have expected because God is present in every place and in every moment—so wherever we can find solitude, he will be there.
